All Living Things: The children will be taught to:

- identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood
- recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function
- describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans

PHSCE -

New beginning: The children will focus on developing their skills in four key areas: empathy, self-awareness, social skills and motivation.

Getting on and falling out: The children will gain an understanding of the consequences of antisocial and aggressive behaviours; realise the nature and consequences of racism and that differences and similarities between people arise from a number of factors.

Art and Design

People in action- The children will explore how to convey movement in their work and how movement is portrayed in different aspects of art.

Cooking – The children will design, prepare and make Christmas cakes for old people within our Parish community.

Geography -

Mountains: The children will learn what a mountain environment is and where they are found; what the weather is like and how this compares to other environments.

History

The Victorians: The children will learn who the Victorians were and when they lived; the important changes that happened during this period and what life was like for children.
